K. Other Committee, Board Representative and Trustee Reports

<u>Trustee Adams</u> advised that she brought greetings on behalf of the Board at the 20th Annual Edmonton Public Schools' Christian Programs Commissioning Service on September 17, 2015. Trustees Johner and Chubb also attended the event. She noted that the programs serve over 3,300 district students.

<u>Trustee Adams</u>, the Board's representative on the Edmonton Public Schools Foundation Board of Governors, thanked Lauderdale School for providing space for the Foundation office and for the tremendous support the staff have provided. <u>Trustee Ip</u> advised that he attended the 2nd Annual Traffic Safety Day at Westbrook School. Westbrook School has been very successful in improving student safety during peak pick-up and drop-off times through various awareness campaigns throughout the year and their partnership with Edmonton Police Service and the City of Edmonton

<u>Trustee Draper</u> advised that she had participated in the Reading Rally at Fraser School on September 15, 2015. Volunteers from Stantec and Calgary Reads organized the event. Chris Love from NOW Radio was the guest reader. She noted people can take the <u>Pledge to Read</u> to support their love of reading.

<u>Trustee Draper</u> advised that registration is now open for the <u>13th Annual Literacy & Learning Day Conference</u> taking place on October 24, 2015 at the Shaw Conference Centre. The Conference is targeted to parents and caregivers.

<u>Trustee Janz</u> noted that the District's public Board meetings take place on the traditional land of Treaty 6 Territory. The Board will recognize this at the beginning of each public Board meeting.



<u>Trustee Martin</u> advised that, yesterday, he attended the official launch at City Hall of an amiskwaciy history series. He also attended the launch, yesterday, of a new Parent Link Centre sponsored by Norwood Child and Family Services Resource Centre. The Centre will be close to McDougall School at the St. John's Institute.

<u>Trustee Chubb</u> advised that he and Trustees Adams and Johner attended the CASA Child, Adolescent and Family Mental Health Child Annual General Meeting on September 16, 2015. He congratulated Lillian Osborne School Principal Janet Hancock as well as her husband Dave Hancock who received an award at the AGM for their contribution to child mental health. Principal Hancock does excellent work at her school in support of child mental health.

<u>Trustee Johner</u> advised that, on September 18, 2015, she attended a celebration at Queen Elizabeth School recognizing their becoming a member of the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization (UNESCO) Associated Schools Project Network. The school is one of only two high schools in Alberta to receive this prestigious designation. Education Minister Eggen, MLA Nielsen, Assistant Superintendent Muhlethaler were also in attendance. She also commended Queen Elizabeth School for winning the <u>Greenest School in Canada Award</u> – an honour it shared with a school in Ontario. The schools will now compete at the internationals for the Greenest School on the Earth award.
