<u>The Board Chair</u> called the meeting to order with recognition that we are on Treaty 6 Territory, a traditional meeting grounds, gathering place, and travelling route to the Cree, Saulteaux, Blackfoot, Métis, Dene and Nakota Sioux. We acknowledge all the many First Nations, Métis, and Inuit whose footsteps have marked these lands for centuries.

<u>The Board Chair</u> advised that the fire alarm system at the Centre for Education is a Two Stage alarm system. Stage One is a single repeating alarm tone indicating a warning only and that evacuation is not required. Stage Two is a triple repeating alarm tone indicating that evacuation is required.

<u>The Board Chair</u> advised those attending the meeting in person that the floor area is restricted to the Board of Trustees, Superintendent, Director of Board and Superintendent Relations and Recording staff, with an area reserved for media. She advised that she would signify to any other staff or registered speakers to come down to the floor at the designated time on the agenda. The Board Chair thanked everyone for their cooperation.

She said that as a District it is important to continue to make it a priority to keep parents, as primary caregivers, involved, as much as possible, in conversations which involve the well-being of their children.

<u>The Board Chair</u> advised that she will send a letter to the Minister of Education advising him that the Board of Trustees unanimously approved First, Second and Third Reading for Board Policies FA.BP Human Resources Framework, HFA.BP Sexual Orientation and Gender Identity and HG.BP Student Behaviour with required revisions that support alignment to Bill 24: *An Act to Support Gay-Straight Alliances*.

K. Other Committee, Board Representative and Trustee Reports

Trustee Adams submitted the following written report:

Trustee Adams appreciated the special opportunity on June 6, 2018, to spend time with the principals in Ward I at the District Leadership Management tea that followed the Superintendent's comments and meeting with the Assistant Superintendents.

Trustee Adams attended the Dan Knott Grade 9 farewell on June 6, 2018. She noted that it was a pleasure to bring greetings on behalf of the Board of Trustees and to express appreciation for the support that so many give to ensure the success of the graduates.

Trustee Adams reported that the Millwoods Presidents' Council was held on June 7, 2018, at the Leefield Community Hall. She noted that the meetings provide the opportunity to hear about the activities and community plans from each of the presidents representing their individual community leagues, as well as the work from several elected officials and community organizations that attend. Trustee Adams noted than an important discussion took place regarding the pressing need for a high school in the southeast and that the meeting provided the opportunity for the MLAs and City Councillors to be alerted yet again how critical a school is to the community.



Trustee Adams advised that the Millwoods Early Childhood Coalition (MWECC) meeting took place on June 8, 2018, and that there was a discussion regarding a possible partnering of Edmonton Public Schools and MWECC to host an early years conference next year. Trustee Adams advised that she will follow up with the Director, Ms Wendy Keiller, before the end of June 2018 to discuss this further.

Trustee Adams thanked MLAs Loyola, Woollard and Minister Gray for the special invitation to attend the community Iftar on the evening of June 9, 2018, celebrating the month of Ramadan for the Muslim community. Trustee Adams appreciated meeting many wonderful people and noted that it was an excellent opportunity to discuss the critical need for a school in the southeast.

Trustee Adams reported that the work being done by parent councils is appreciated very much and that it was encouraging to see the good representation of parents at the last Sakaw and Menisa council meetings. Trustee Adams noted that both Principals McLean and Mulder have established themselves very well in their first year as principals in these schools and have excellent rapport with parents who expressed appreciation for their leadership over the past year and their anticipation for working together in the coming year. She advised that there was a good discussion regarding the role of trustee and that the Sakaw council discussed student dress codes.

Trustee Adams advised that the annual District Retirement Banquet is a very special evening for the Board of Trustees as it provides an occasion to express their appreciation for the dedicated service of many committed individuals and the invaluable contributions made by them for the success of District students.

Trustee Adams noted that it is a highlight for her as a Trustee to bring greetings on behalf of the Board of Trustees and to address students as they transition to high school, post-secondary school or on to other things. She looks forward to attending the awards night at Kate Chegwin and T.D. Baker Schools and the J. Percy Page Commencement ceremony.

Trustee Adams will be attending the mural unveiling at the Shauna May Seneca School, Summer Fun Day at Bisset School and a meeting with City Council during the next two weeks.

<u>Trustee Estabrooks</u> had the pleasure of attending a celebration at City Hall School with hundreds of students from Edmonton Public Schools and teacher Linda Hut. She explained that great things happen at City Hall School that impact student lives for years to come and that it was an honour to bring greetings on behalf of the Board of Trustees.

Trustee Estabrooks along with other Trustees, students from Edmonton Public Schools and her own children, had a great time walking in this year's Pride Parade. Trustee Estabrooks thanked everyone that helped organize Edmonton Public Schools involvement in this year's Pride Parade.



Trustee Estabrooks congratulated the Eastglen graduates. She advised that the school's commencement ceremony was held on the weekend and that it was a wonderful experience to be among such accomplished and passionate graduates.

Trustee Stirling submitted the following written report:

Trustee Stirling had the honour of bringing greetings on behalf of the Board of Trustees at the annual Public School Administrators Association (PSAA) wine-down and retirement celebration.

Trustee Stirling thanked the Edith Rogers School for welcoming her to their Grade 9 celebration.

Trustee Stirling reported that the Braemar School and Vimy Ridge Academy commencement ceremonies were wonderful evenings of joyful celebration with students, staff, families, and friends. She congratulated all the graduates.
