<u>The Board Chair</u> called the meeting to order with recognition that we are on Treaty 6 Territory, a traditional meeting grounds, gathering place, and travelling route to the Cree, Saulteaux, Blackfoot, Métis, Dene and Nakota Sioux. We acknowledge all the many First Nations, Métis and Inuit whose footsteps have marked these lands for centuries.

<u>The Board Chair</u> advised that the fire alarm system at the Centre for Education is a two-stage alarm system. Stage One is a single repeating alarm tone indicating a warning only and that evacuation is not required. Stage Two is a triple repeating alarm tone indicating that evacuation is required.

D. <u>Communications from the Board Chair</u>

<u>The Board Chair</u> acknowledged that the fall session of the Legislature begins today and said that the Division is looking forward to continuing to work with this government and sharing with Minister LaGrange the financial reality of supporting students and keeping classrooms safe during a pandemic.

The Board Chair said there are many students, staff and families who have been affected by the pandemic — whether directly by testing positive or having a family member test positive for COVID-19 or being told to isolate at home for two weeks. The Board Chair remarked that the effect of this pandemic on students and families is far reaching and that she appreciates all the work staff in Division schools are doing to support students during this challenging time.

The Board Chair thanked families who indicated which learning option they would like their child to take for Quarter 2. The Board Chair recognized it is challenging for staff to accommodate parent choice for online or in-person learning, and said she believes offering choice is the strength of Edmonton Public Schools re-entry plan and speaks to how this Division is stepping up to support families.

E. <u>Communications from the Superintendent of Schools</u>

<u>The Superintendent</u> thanked students and families for letting the Division know their choice of inperson or online learning for Quarter 2. He shared that just over 32,000 students have selected online learning for Quarter 2, which is an increase of about 3,600 students from Quarter 1. The Superintendent said that family choice is a central pillar of the Division's re-entry plan and that the Division is glad that it can extend the options for students in these challenging times.

The Superintendent congratulated the 2020 Division Student Award recipients. He explained that every year the Division recognizes outstanding student accomplishments, contributions and achievements. The Superintendent shared that the Division has six categories for students who were in Grade 12 during the 2019-2020 school year. The six categories are:

- Academic Excellence
- Career and Life Pathways
- Fine Arts
- Health and Wellness
- Humanities
- Math/Science/Technologies

The Superintendent advised that this year, 117 Grade 12 students from 21 difference high schools are being recognized.

Trustee Adams submitted the following Alberta School Boards Association (ASBA) Zone 2/3 report in writing:

ASBA Zone 2/3 is looking at changing their meetings to a location with better technical capacity and is working out possible arrangements with the Centre for Education. Trustee Adams reports that meetings will vary between being in person and virtual. The Fall General Meeting (FGM) will be held virtually on November 16, 2020. Any emergent policies had to have been submitted by October 12, 2020.

Trustee Draper reported that the Edmonton Public Schools Foundation recently had their Annual General Meeting. She thanked the outgoing Chair, Louise Hayes. As Trustee representative for the Foundation, Trustee Draper is looking forward to working with incoming Chair Linda Miller. Trustee Draper share that the Foundation is looking forward to the joint meeting with the Board of Trustees in December 2020.

Trustee Janz advised that he recently made a presentation the City Hall School and participated virtually in READ IN week. He thanked the teachers and students for their engagement.
