<u>The Board Chair</u> called the meeting to order with recognition that we are on Treaty 6 Territory, a traditional meeting grounds, gathering place, and travelling route to the Cree, Saulteaux, Blackfoot, Métis, Dene and Nakota Sioux. We acknowledge all the many First Nations, Métis, and Inuit whose footsteps have marked these lands for centuries.

The Board Chair advised everyone that the fire alarm system at the Centre for Education is a two-stage alarm system. Stage One is a single repeating alarm tone indicating a warning only and evacuation is not required. Stage Two is a triple repeating alarm tone indicating that evacuation is required.

#### D. Communications from the Board Chair

The Board Chair thanked teachers and staff in the Division's schools who are continuing to navigate the challenges of COVID-19. She said that each day the Division sees new COVID-19 cases in schools and staff are doing their best to support students, parents and each other during this time. The Board Chair acknowledged that many parents have received either late night or early morning phone calls from staff notifying them to keep their children home for two weeks due to a COVID-19 case in their school. She recognized that these can be stressful times for staff, students and families.

The Board Chair advised that the Division continues to follow the guidance and medical expertise of Alberta Health Services (AHS) and explained they are the health experts and the Division relies on their expertise on how to manage COVID-19 in Division schools. The Board Chair thanked the thousands of AHS staff who are working hard to ensure access to testing sites for teachers, families and students.

<u>The Board Chair</u> also thanked the Division, in particular Superintendent Robertson, for working so collaboratively with other school divisions in sharing Division online resources. The Board Chair said that she has received several kind letters from other board chairs thanking the Division for being so collaborative and supportive during this time.

### E. <u>Communications from the Superintendent of Schools</u>

The Superintendent acknowledged the passing of one of the Division's school namesakes, Nellie Carlson. He shared that Mrs. Carlson, a Cree women who lost her Indigenous status when she married a Métis man, died on September 10, 2020, at the age of 93. He said that she and her husband, Elmer, had 11 children together and were married for 73 years. The Superintendent advised that Nellie created the advocacy group *Indian Rights for Indian Women*, and eventually was able to reclaim her treaty rights and help thousands of other Indigenous Canadians in similar situations. The Superintendent expressed that the Division was honoured to celebrate her passion for education, community and equity by naming a school after her in 2016 and said that she was an active part of the school community, attending several Indigenous Peoples Day events, mentoring staff and acting as an Elder at the school. The Superintendent stated that the Division is grateful for Nellie's many gifts to the community. On behalf of the Division, the Superintendent offered condolences to her family.

The Superintendent thanked staff, families and students for their collaboration to ensure the Division's learning environments are next to none during these unprecedented times.

5. Motion re: Edmonton Public Schools Model for the Collection of Race-Based Data



#### **MOVED BY Trustee Estabrooks:**

"Given that collecting race-based data is one necessary step in working to dismantle systemic racism and racial discrimination, the Edmonton Public School Board formally requests that Administration develop a model for the collection of race-based data in our Division, in consultation with communities in Edmonton impacted by racism." (UNANIMOUSLY CARRIED)

<u>Trustee Dunn</u> requested that updates be provided to the Trustees and general public on an ongoing basis, including next steps. The Superintendent advised that he will keep the Board apprised about the project. He explained that the initial steps for the project will be initiated in October to develop a project charter and will provide an update to the Trustees in December 2020.

### • Use of funds:

How has administration used the re-allocated funds from RCSD for this school year? How has this impacted the number of mental health therapists and other health care professionals available to students in schools compared to the 2019-2020 school year?
