D. Communications from the Board Chair

<u>The Board Chair</u> wished a belated and happy Holi to all those who celebrated the Hindu day of significance last week. She learned more about Holi thanks in part to the beautiful, colourful photos that were shared with her via social media, and also through the Division's interfaith calendar. Holi is an <u>incident</u> ancient Hindu festival also known as the Festival of Spring or the Festival of Colours.

<u>The Board Chair</u> shared that she attended many school council meetings in the last two weeks and the communication coming from the Division school leaders to the Division school communities about the changes happening as a result of loosened COVID restrictions has been clear and kind. She thanked the staff in the Division for leading this work. She thanked the parents and staff who continue to navigate the pandemic and support each other and their school communities.

<u>The Board Chair</u> spoke about the Provincial announcement of increased funding to support charter schools. She said as advocates of public education, who she has the honor to serve with on this Board of Trustees, they believe public dollars belong in public education - a system that is truly accessible for everyone.

<u>The Board Chair</u> noted that yesterday was the International Day for the Elimination of Racial Discrimination. It is a day to remember that while some progress has been made, Black, Indigenous, People of Colour, racialized communities and religious minorities continue to face racism and discrimination daily. And while the Division has taken steps to address racial discrimination in Division schools, all of us recognize more must be done.
