D. Communications from the Board Chair

The Board Chair shared that February is Black History Month and thanked school communities who were taking the time to celebrate the contributions of Black Canadians and Black Albertans. Black History Month's theme this year is, "Ours to Tell." Black History is Canadian History and including the contributions, sacrifices and triumphs of Black Albertans in the new Alberta curriculum is essential. She shared that she spent Saturday afternoon learning about the contributions of Black Albertans, for example, the sleeping car porters and what life was like for Black settlers who came to places like Amber Valley in the early 1900s. The Board Chair encouraged everyone to visit the online exhibit titled "And still we rise," written and curated by Dr. Jennifer Kelly. This resource has been used in some Edmonton Public schools and is an incredible resource that shows the formation of Alberta's Black communities from the late 1800s to the early 1970s.

The Board Chair thanked the Minister of Education, Adriana LaGrange, for visiting the Alberta School for the Deaf, which is part of Edmonton Public. She thanked the staff at the school and Principal Sandra Mason for hosting the event, as the Minister announced additional one-time funding for students who are blind, visually impaired, deaf, hard of hearing or those with complex communication needs. The Board Chair said the school was a wonderful place and it was an honour to share the school's history, and meet students and staff alongside the Minister.

E. Communications from the Superintendent of Schools

The Superintendent thanked the Board for including him in their planning meetings that were held last week. He commended the Board on their commitment to undertaking professional learning to advance their work with the Division. He also appreciated the time and thoughtfulness the Board dedicated to planning and advocating to ensure Edmonton Public students get what they need to be successful.

The Superintendent advised it is open house season. Whether the open house visit is virtual or in person, parents and students are going to be checking out one of the Division's 215 schools and multiple programs. He said it's a big decision point for lots of families, and the Division is endeavoring to provide families with great information. The Superintendent acknowledged the growth in the city has, in some cases, limited some families' choices. He said the Division will continue to try to make sure that we're accommodating as many kids as possible in great supportive learning environments. He said he expects that this will be a topic of discussion during upcoming conversations about the Division's Three-Year Capital Plan and Ten-Year Facilities Plan. These will be important conversations as Edmonton is a wonderful place for families. The Division's strives to ensure that our families have a great choice in public education.

ISSUE

ISSUE

The Student Senate is presenting to the Board of Trustees an update of their work in support of their 2022-2023 Work Plan.

BACKGROUND

At the November 1, 2022, public Board meeting, Student Trustees brought forward a report to the Board introducing this year's Student Trustees and executive. At that meeting, the Student Trustees also shared with the Board that, through a survey of their peers, they found that students were most interested in three sub-topics that sit under the overarching umbrella of mental health - transitions from high school, supporting students with school work and mental health supports for students. The Student Trustees also shared that, given the common theme and overlapping subject areas, rather than create project groups based around theme, Student Senators chose to all work on the same theme, but created working groups based on three different media/approaches:

- presentation (panel, individual, live or recorded),
- media (brochure, poster, etc.), and
- networking (group, forum, event, etc.).

Students also decided to form a group to work on Student Senate promotion. Each working group is supported by an adult advisor.

CURRENT SITUATION

The Student Senate has met four times since their last presentation to the Board. In those meetings, each group analyzed the feedback from the student survey and then completed a detailed project plan, which included a SMART outcome, environmental scan, project overview, action plan and evaluation plan.

While the January and February meetings were online, all in-person meetings have also been offered asynchronously on Google Meet. This has supported a strong attendance, despite weather and illness.

Information Report

At their December meeting, Student Senators welcomed Trustees to share in a meal and the group had a rich conversation based on the following questions:

Over the last two years...

- 1. What did you learn about resilience and mental health?
- 2. What were your experiences with online learning?
- 3. What were your greatest successes? What are you most proud of?
- 4. Are there any other "takeaways" you'd like to share?

At their January meeting, Echo Schmidek, Division Communications Consultant, shared information on digital tools and media best practices. This information was gratefully received by the Senators as groups are exploring the opportunities presented with online panels, podcasts, and protocols for booking and interviewing guest speakers. Student Senators also received a refresher on the *Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act* (FOIP) at their February meeting, so that they can be sure to be following Division responsibilities as set out by the Act and to ensure that project participants are informed about the process for sharing their information. Student Senators also had the opportunity to contribute to the development of this year's Division Feedback Survey by offering feedback on content.

KEY POINTS

- For their 2022-2023 work plan, the Student Senate selected three topics under the umbrella of mental health: transitions from high school, supporting students with school work and mental health supports for students.
- To carry out their work, Student Senators have formed three smaller groups, based on the approach they wish to take for their work: presentation, media or networking.
- A fourth group has been formed to focus on promoting the Student Senate.
- Student Trustees will present a final summary of this year's work to the Board of Trustees in June 2023.

ISSUE

Attached are the Division's 2022-2023 class size reporting results, along with two years of historical data.

BACKGROUND

Alberta Education implemented the Class Size Information System (CSIS) across Alberta in the 2004-2005 school year. This system facilitated the reporting by jurisdictions on a number of class size measures. Class size information for semester one and full year classes is reported as of the September Count Date each year.

In the fall of 2019, the province removed the requirement for boards to report class size information. The Board of Trustees of the day decided that Edmonton Public Schools will continue to collect and publish class size data consistent with previous reporting requirements by the Alberta government. The Board consulted with Division Administration to develop a reporting model that considers both class size and complexity.

CURRENT SITUATION

In the past, collection of this data has been a highly laborious process for both school staff and central units. For the last two years, data within PowerSchool was used to develop class size data. This required the creation and refining of a number of new processes and reports. Staff at individual schools were contacted when further information was required to support the data harvested from PowerSchool, with required changes implemented thereafter. As school staff and central units continue working together to refine the methodology, it is anticipated that in future years the changes will result in significant time savings for schools and Student Information in preparing the reports.

Reports have been produced which mimic the reports previously produced by Alberta Education. These reports display class size averages over a three-year period including a jurisdiction summary by grade for all subjects and for core subjects. Aggregated data for the Division can be found in the All Subjects and Core Subjects reports (Attachments I and II). Individual school information reports for All Subjects and for Core Subjects are also provided (Attachments III and IV).

KEY POINTS

- Average class size on both reports, All Subjects (Attachment I) and Core Subjects (Attachment II), generally reveals a small increase over last year for Division I, II and III.
- Division IV is reporting a slight decrease in the total percentage of classes with more than 26 students, while all other divisions are reporting a shift to more classes at 26 students or greater.
- The largest class at each division is fairly consistent with prior years, with the exception of Division IV
 which saw an increase to the largest class. This may be attributed to the increased programming of
 Instrumental Music following the removal of COVID restrictions.
- No values are presented for this year for the Online Reg K-9 School and the Learning Store at Circle Square on Attachment II and IV as Argyll Centre is once again providing all online learning for the Division.
- Health no longer has any values for the current year for both Division I and II as the new provincial program of studies has combined health and physical education into a single class.
- The class size data does not consider the program, such as French Immersion or Cogito, in which the students are enrolled.
- When students are in multi-grade classes of Grade 3/4, those classes are included in the Division II
 average, Grade 6/7 classes are included in the Division III average and Grade 9/10 classes are
 included in the Division IV average.
- Glendale, Montrose, Mount Royal, Sherwood and Westlawn Schools were closed at the end of the 2020-21 school year and as a result have no data listed for either 2021-22 or 2022-23. Similarly, some schools have only one or two years of data reflecting that they have been opened within the last three years.
