In the fall of 2022, Edmonton Public Schools conducted a student demographic survey to learn more about the students we serve. Students in Grades 4 to 12 had an opportunity to share information about themselves. The questions on the survey addressed the following:

- Indigenous identity
- racial identity
- ethnicity
- religion or spiritual affiliation
- gender identity
- sexual orientation (Grades 7 to 12 only)

Participation in the survey was completely voluntary. Parents who did not want their child to participate could opt their child out. Students who participated in the survey only responded to questions they felt comfortable answering.

More than 55,800 students responded to the survey, which is a 73 per cent response rate. I want to thank students who took time to complete the survey. We are incredibly grateful for their willingness to share information about themselves. We are proud that students in our schools come from a variety of backgrounds, cultures, communities and experiences.
