Student Demographic Survey *Glossary: Grade* 4–6



The following glossary is for students in grades 4-6 to use as they come across unfamiliar or new terms during the Student Demographic Survey. This glossary has been divided into each of the identity topics.

1.	Indigenous Identity
2.	Racial Identity
3.	Ethnic Identity
4.	Religious/Spiritual Affiliation
5.	Gender Identity

1. Indigenous Identity

The term Indigenous peoples refers to the distinct people who, for centuries, have been caretakers of North America. Indigenous peoples in Canada, refers to the First Nations, Inuit and Métis people-the original inhabitants of this land and their living descendants.

First Nations refers to a distinct nation or group of Indigenous people with their own languages, traditions, protocols, spiritual and cultural practices. Each group has their own traditional government with hereditary leaders or leaders chosen by the people of the group.

Métis means a person who self identifies as Métis and is recognized by a Métis community. Métis are distinct from other Indigenous peoples, and have their own history, culture, language, flag, songs, dance and stories.

Inuit means "the people" in the Inuktitut language. Inuit communities are spread across the vast region of Canada referred to as "Inuit Nunangat", an Inuit term that includes land, water, and ice. Inuit have an oral history with distinct traditions, languages, beliefs, songs, art and culture.

2. Racial Identity

The way in which a person sees oneself as being part of a particular racial group.

For this survey, "race" is an idea that groups people together based on common ancestry and characteristics, often physical (e.g., skin colour, facial features), and affects how some people are perceived and treated. Race is a social construct.

3. Ethnic Identity

The combination of beliefs, behaviours and traditions held in a group of people who have a common heritage, ancestry, or historical past, often with identifiable culture, language and/or religion.

4. Religion/Spiritual Affiliation

Religion has been defined as personal beliefs connected to an individual's spiritual faith.

5. Gender Identity

Gender Identity is each person's internal and individual experience of gender. It is a person's sense of being a girl, a boy, both, neither, or anywhere along the gender spectrum. A person's gender identity may be the same as or different from their gender assigned at birth.¹

Non-Binary: People who do not feel like the words "girl" or "boy" is right for them. They may feel like both or neither. They sometimes use pronouns such as they, them, theirs.

Transgender: When your gender identity (how you feel) is different from your body or what other people believe your gender to be.

Two-Spirit: Refers to an Indigeneous person who identifies as having both a masculine and a feminine spirit.
