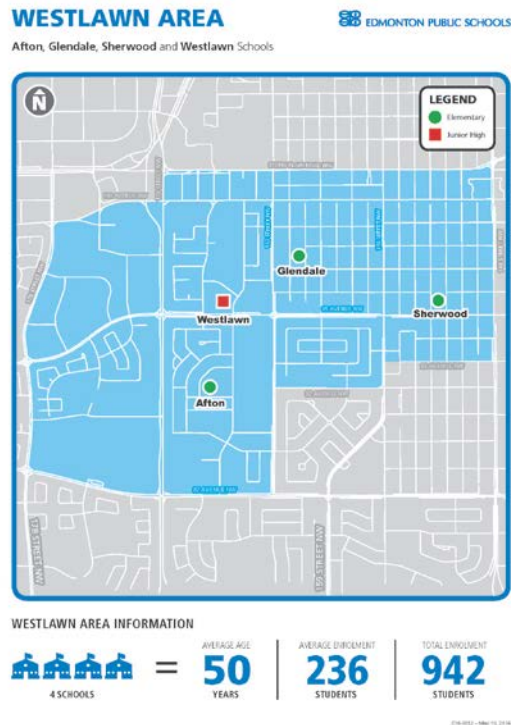


Public Meeting #2 – Feedback (Raw)

The meeting consisted of a general presentation followed by optional facilitated breakout sessions. Approximately 34 participants were present for the presentation and 23 participants took part in the breakout sessions spread over 3 rooms.

- New school over modernization. Afton design is poor (inside classrooms without natural light)

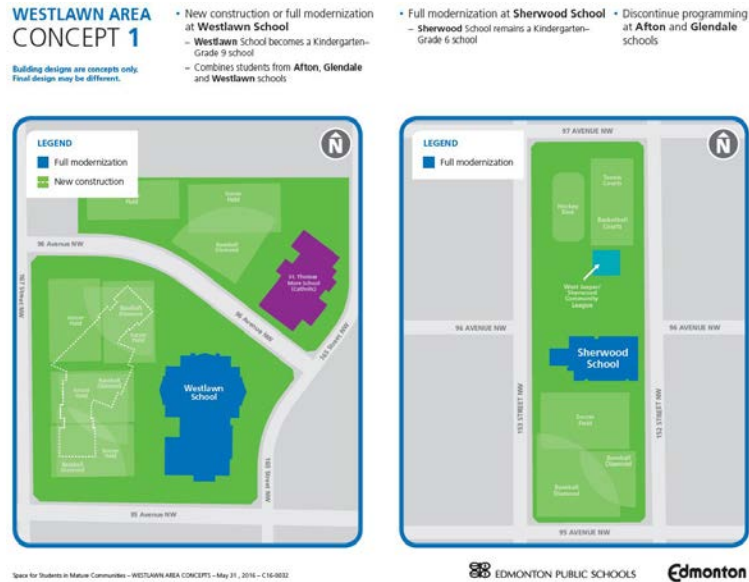

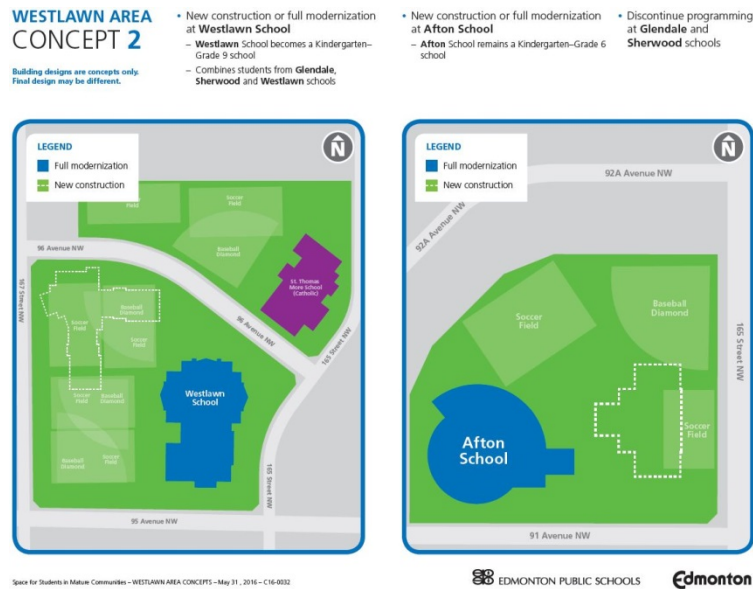
- Question: When will schools be built?

- Question: Why such a strong emphasis on Westlawn? (in every option) (95 ave a busy street). Roland: Central. Larger site of four. None of four sites are very large. Isolated/segregated school sites from earlier planning approaches. Possible to do custom design for the sites.
- Other K-4's in city? Roland: Ellerslie Primary
- What happens to closed sites? Roland: Retained for another district use. Used/purchased by non profits. Joint Use allows other school districts to acquire. Charter school. City of Edmonton with first right to acquire. City may identify other needs/interests as well.
- Main concern is to see an unused school.
- K-9 in Westlawn, does this include full day K? Roland: Would look at continuity of programming. Based on need.
- Will Arts program be available at Sherwood? Consistent programming at both schools (Arts). Each school should have equal programs.

WESTLAWN AREA CONCEPT 3

Building designs are concepts only.
Final design may be different.

- New construction or full modernization at **Glendale School***
 - Glendale School becomes a Kindergarten–Grade 4 school
 - Combines students from **Afton, Glendale** and **Sherwood** schools

*New construction would require a custom, two-storey design

- New construction or full modernization at **Westlawn School**
 - Westlawn School becomes a Grades 5–9 school
 - Combines students from **Afton, Glendale, Sherwood** and **Westlawn** schools

- Discontinue programming at **Afton** and **Sherwood** schools

What do you see as the **STRENGTHS** of Concept 3?

Room 1

- K-4 allows younger kids to be nurtured.
- Walkability of quiet streets around Glendale.

What do you see as the **CHALLENGES** of Concept 3?

Room 1

- Locates all lower elementary to north end of cluster. Poor choice for K.
- All students relocated while schools are built.

Room 2

- Displaced students - those who cannot stay at school during construction phase
- Grade 5's and grade 6'ers in with grade 9's BUT better than having K-9.

Room 3

- Where do students get relocated temporarily? What happens with busing for kids who currently walk, etc? Perhaps my childcare/afterschool care is at that school. How does the parent pay for the extra expenses?

- What will the kids do who can't bus? (Yellow or ETS)
- Timing of construction/renos - disruption for students and parents
- Worrisome is huge about travel, school location, disruption in schedule and schoolmates

Concept 3: Additional Comments

Room 1

- How will relationships between parents, students, and school staff be maintained in a larger school?
- Do not like use of Bessie Nichols as a comparison because of overcrowding and size.
- Request to hear from parents who have gone through this (what they like and don't like) to learn from mistakes.
- Impact of consolidation on number of casinos? Casino funding very important. Applies to all concepts. Important to families with less \$ resources.
- Does increased size of new schools mitigate need for casino revenue? Terry: New schools get quite a bit of provincial funding for technology. School will have ongoing funding to maintain. Casino funding would not be needed as much for technology.
- Add an elevator to Glendale? Terry: Yes
- Request to see more information on modernization options and cost benefit analysis. Terry: Next phase will look at design concepts.
- Question: Why are we being asked the community questions? Cllr. Knack: Provide the City with some information of what's important to residents if a school closes.
- Question: Are we looking at seniors housing? Cllr. Knack: Likes the idea. School Act currently does not allow this. May be included in future drafts of MGA.
- Trustee Ch: Open to looking at these options for future use. Multi purpose building would be excellent (rather than single use purpose built) so that the building can evolve over time. Legislation and funding required will take time.
- Question: Timeline? Trustee Ch: Depends on provincial funding
- Question: Will these capital requests be prioritized high enough to receive funding? Terry: Placeholders for these

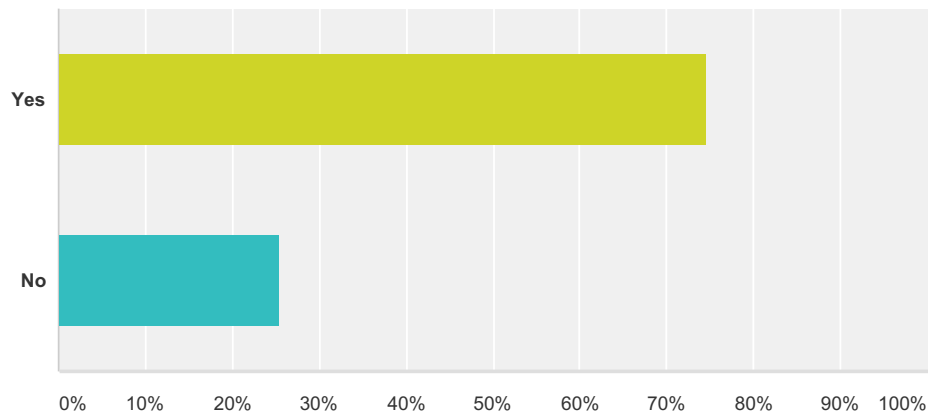
- Mindful of school design.

Q1 Do you currently live in the Westlawn Cluster?

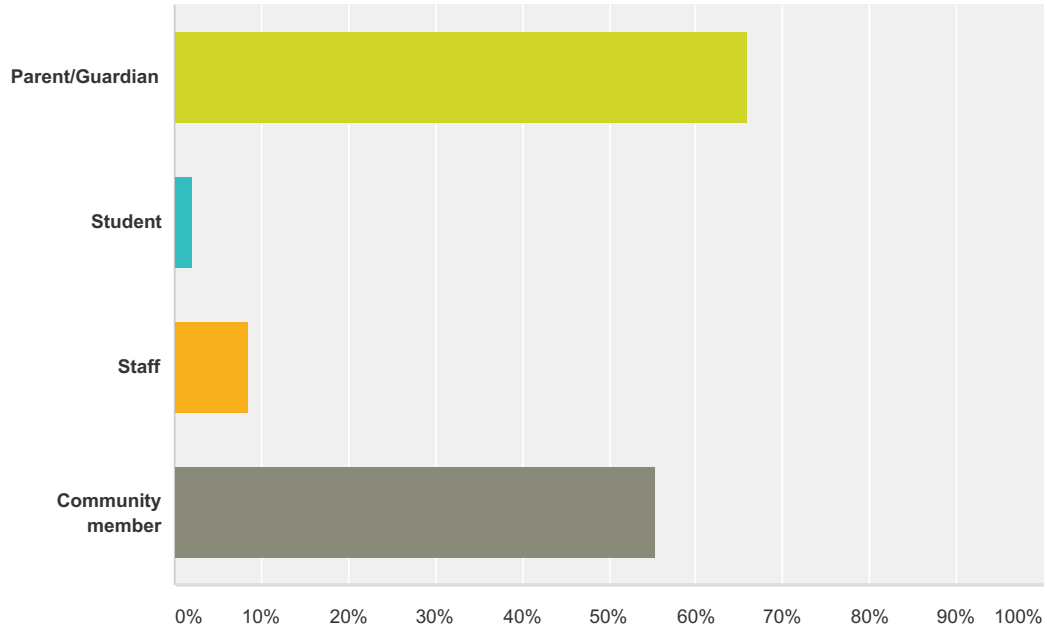

2	There doesn't appear to be much growth happening in the Sherwood community, and I doubt having a future LRT track running nearby is going to stimulate much revitalization. There are few services in the area. Most of the traffic from parents in that zone will come from east of the school, meaning most parents that drive to the school will likely have to turn left across 95 avenue to return home. Maybe this is the case now, but when enrollment grows considerably, it seems like a potential hazard. Play space is split between the north and south side of Sherwood School, making supervision more difficult when there are a lot of kids attending. Public transit stops near the school are right on the busy (and often, awfully dirty) 95 avenue. The Sherwood School site only allows a new school construction on the same site. This will mean a lot of disruption for Sherwood students as they have to spend a couple years in a different school before moving back. So all affected kids will be coming into the new school from other schools where they have gotten comfortable and formed relationships. 1	Good field space at both schools. 2 schools with k-6 grades so not as many classes of the same grade. Afton isn't on a busy road. Afton is in a neighborhood with a lot of young families coming in.	6/17/2016 12:52 AM
2	This concept seems to maximize the amount of connected green space on each site, giving more play space and making supervision easier. Within the catchment area, it is the most central, and the Afton site already gets a lot of people driving into the catchment area for the Arts Core programming, so the location has not discouraged people. It aligns with the character of the neighbourhood, which is built as a cluster of schools and other facilities. There are 2 high schools, 2 elementary schools and 1 junior high, all within 3 blocks of each other, and the roads are designed to manage and direct school traffic. There is also a swimming pool and field house in easy walking distance of Afton, and the hospital, parent link centre, long-term care facility and health clinic offer great opportunities for community partnerships. The West Meadowlark community also seems to be slowly revitalizing and diversifying. Each year, some of the more senior residents move out and younger families from a range of backgrounds tend to buy their houses. There is also potential for some higher density housing development, in addition to the apartments and townhouses that already exist, pointing to a future of growth in the community. Future LRT construction will make living near WEM more attractive and could lead to more community revitalization, as well. West Meadowlark has a strong community league that just finished construction of a spray park last year, another attraction for young families. If a new school is built on the Afton site, current students won't have to move, thus minimizing the number of students who have to change schools. Afton's population has shown a need and appetite for before and after school care, currently offered onsite. This group would likely welcome full-day Kindergarten, too, and having the 2 elementary schools so close to each other would make it easier to defend a decision to offer full-day kindergarten and child care in just one of the sites, which is probably the school board's preference as they often resist leasing space in new buildings to third parties.	6/14/2016 3:40 PM
